The Life & Many Loves Of Robert Mantell

Greg Caggiano, author, historian

Before audiences fell in love with Rudolph Valentino, there was Robert Mantell. A veteran theater actor, Mantell captivated crowds with an extensive Shakespearean repertoire and commanding presence on stage. He forayed briefly into silent films, but passed away before achieving the same fame he had in the theater. Mantell called Atlantic Highlands his summer home for more than 20 years and became a well-loved figure in the community. However, he is as well-known for his four high-profile marriages as he was for his acting. Two of which ended under tragic and mysterious circumstances. Historian Greg Caggiano traces the career of Robert Mantell as well as his many loves, life in the Atlantic Highlands, and what brought such a famous individual to the Jersey Shore. Colors Of The Ancient World Rachael Goldman, PhD

The long-accepted theory that color in monuments and sculpture was distained by the ancients has been debunked by scholars. We will consider how color was used in daily life, from the people who created the colors to those who wore them and how color was used in private and public life. Romans, in particular, attached nuanced implications to colors, using color as a form of cultural assessment, defining social values and order. Using color, they made judgments about social class, gender roles, and ethnic groups, maintaining the status quo. We will evaluate the different types of evidence and the approaches that have been used to recreate colored sculptures, highlighting the language and consciousness each social and cultural group displayed. Ancient Mediterranean peoples embraced the concept of appropriateness for display and appearance, and we will consider how they were able to negotiate those boundaries. Is The Supreme Court Accountable To Anyone?

Justice Alito has stated this Court is not accountable to Congress. Is that true? Article III of the Constitution established the Court as a separate branch of government. Congress also funds the Court. Congressional Judiciary Acts have set the justices' salaries, and the term of their tenure as well as the Court's docket and its appellate jurisdiction. Its decisions are the supreme law of the land, binding Congress and the President. Has the Court's power to interpret the Constitution made it more powerful than either Congress or the President? Classic American Genres

Calling all movie buffs! Join Johnathan for an intriguing look at three classic American film genres.

Oct 9: HORROR

The horror genre originated from a cultural need to confront and vicariously conquer things that threaten the normal order of things, including personal fears and societal changes. We'll discuss the origins of this genre viewing examples that range from creepy to campy. More importantly, examine how certain horror films directly reflected American social changes, including *The Wolf Man, Invasion of the Body Snatchers, The Blob,* and *Psycho.* We'll leave the lights on!

Nov 13: THE WESTERN

The western genre far predates the advent of cinema and is truly a form of American mythology. We'll examine these narratives' roots in the American experience, and their themes of honor, individualism, and the pursuit of justice. We'll view examples from *The Great Train Robbery, The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance,* and *Unforgiven*.

Dec 11: THE MUSICAL

The musical genre was born of the natural adaptation from musical theater into film. We'll discuss how early musicals like The *Jazz Singer* and *42nd Street* helped to develop musical genre conventions unique to cinema. We will then see the progression through films like *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes, Grease,* and *La Land.*

Back by popular demand – Author, Elena Gorokhova We're thrilled to welcome Elena back for a discussion of her critically acclaimed memoir, *A Mountain of Crumbs*.

Growing up in Leningrad, now St. Petersburg in a courtyard: a crumbling façade as was expected from every Young Pioneer, wearing a red kerchief around her neck, she promised to live, study, and work as the great Lenin bequeathed every citizen to do.

But she harbored a passion that grew into an un-Soviet failing. Seduced by the beauty of the English language spent years deciphering its secrets, to her mother's bewilderment. Her mother - born three years before the Soviet state - became a mirror image of her Motherland: overbearing, protective, difficult to leave. A front-line surgeon during WWII, she wanted her daughter to be a doctor and a builder of communism, but Elena, in her mother's words, was "stubborn as a goat." What followed was the English Department of Leningrad University, a marriage to a visiting American student, and a scandal, both public and private. After six months of official hurdles and family turmoil, Elena left for America, a ravaged suitcase on the KGB inspector's table with twenty kilograms of what used to be her life. .

In the United States, Elena received a Doctorate in Language Education and has taught at various colleges and universities. She has also written three books. She is married and has a daughter, who is beautiful, talented, smart and stubborn as a goat.

The Revolutionary War Rick Geffkin & Greg Caggiano

The Mysteries Of The 1777 Battle Of Navesink

Accounts of the history of the Revolutionary War often overlook the Battle of Navesink. The war was less than a year old when the First Regiment of the Monmouth Militia occupied a hillside lookout station in February 1777. Surprised by British regulars during a cold winter's night, 25 militiamen were killed, while 72 were captured and sent to the notorious Sugar House Prison where many perished. Although 40 men escaped, some died during their flight. It was a disaster for the Monmouth Militia. This illustrated talk reveals the actual battle site, then and now; the combatants who took part, and the impact on both sides due to this crucial early engagement.

Colonel Tye and the Black Loyalist Movement in Monmouth County He is perhaps the greatest military leader you have ever heard of. Join historian Greg Caggiano for a look at the life and legacy of Colonel Tye, a man who escaped enslavement in Monmouth County and returned as the head of his own fighting force during the American Revolution ... on the British side! The role of Parliament and the politics of early emancipation will also be examined. Learn the heroism, drama, and human element of war in this exciting story and fight for freedom that takes place right in our own backyard. Wed, Nov 13, 10 am-1:30 pm

The sensational discovery of King Tutankhamun's tomb in 1922 prompted a reinterpretation of the Ancient Egyptian civilization, especially through decorative arts. The influence of ancient Egyptian design was seen almost immediately in architecture, graphic arts, jewelry, decorative arts, and even wallpaper. Various interpretations of the culture were created by Wedgewood, Cartier, Castellani, and Louis Comfort Tiffany. We will also consider larger issues of interpretation versus appropriation of cultures and the continued fascination with ancient cultures.
